Umpires:

- Linda Johnston's appointment as Hon Secretary of the Umpires' Committee was approved.
- Two clubs were non-compliant in January. Both are to be fined £25.00.
- 16 people attended the Rules course in January. Rules courses have been organised for 26th & 28th February.
- If umpires' radios are required, the order needs to be placed very soon.
- Concern was expressed about the organisation of the indoor tournaments that resulted in a clash with the Youth and Senior Ladies taking place at the same time in two different venues. Very little notice was received about the tournaments and this meant that there were no umpires available for the Friday night matches.
- Rob Abbott is keen to develop Indoor Hockey. Raymond Hughes will take this on and try to leave 2 or 3 free dates to attract the bigger clubs. Rob is keen to see that it should not be dominated by Leinster teams and that there will be an Irish Indoor team in 2020. Is Rob liaising with Hockey Ireland for free dates from EHL? There will be workshops for umpires for Indoor Hockey in order to get more male indoor umpires involved.
- A sub-committee of the Competitions Committee to promote Indoor hockey should be a priority for next season.

Coaching:

 Chris McCandless's resignation means that a volunteer is needed to report to the board from the Coaching Committee.

Disciplinary:

 Complaint (Confidential) – following consultation with Solicitor, Chair sent letter response to Complainant 15th Feb 2019 addressing points of concern.

Executive Manager's Report

The Executive Manager gave a comprehensive report on the work of the Hockey Office Staff:

 Hockey Ireland Membership System: Dwyne Hill joined Ulster at the four information sessions on incorporation. He provided the clubs with advice on the new membership system along with instructions on how to enter player data. HI has indicated that a Working Group with provincial representation will be convened to consider further usage of the system.

- **UH Awards Dinner** is to be held on 17th May. JP proposed that a small working group be set up to support Andrew Johnston in organising the event.
- Incorporation. Work on the TORs for the UH Ltd Committees needs to be prioritised in the next few weeks. The Draft Articles and proposed structure have been put on the UH website and Clubs have 4 weeks to comment on these.
- Fees: 2 Boys' schools have still not paid their affiliation fees.
- **Sponsorship:** Staff met with Geoff Wilson to develop UH's sponsorship asset register.
- Insurance: A response has been received from Marsh in relation to the proposed Umpires' and Players' insurance. A meeting with Light McCausland and Rankin is needed in relation to the current club cover that has been sold with the use of the Ulster Hockey name.
- Anderson Cup: The trophy has been sent to England for an assessment on the repairs needed.
- Policies & Procedures: JP & BP attended a briefing organised by Sport NI. Good practice was discussed regarding policy review periodicity. Board agreed to adopt the Sport Ni recommended practice whereby existing policies need to be reviewed every 3 years and new policies reviewed after 1 year.
- Youth Development: Linwoods Youth Leagues have resumed with 3 Boys' Blitzes held on 10th February and 5 Girls' Blitzes scheduled for 24th February. Finals days will be 7th & 14th April, with the Girls at Stormont and the Boys at Ballymena Academy. U15 Finals will be in May. The Indoor Leagues were a great success with participation numbers doubling from last year. The BDO McCloy & Pearson Cups have over 200 schools registered this year to take part.
- Coaching courses: Level 1 in Portadown on 17th Feb, 24th Feb
 3rd March and Fundamentals Coaching Course at the
 Ulster University on 21st February.
- **U15** Talent Development Programme & **U18** Development Panel Sessions have resumed after the Christmas break. The **U21** sessions are also ongoing.
